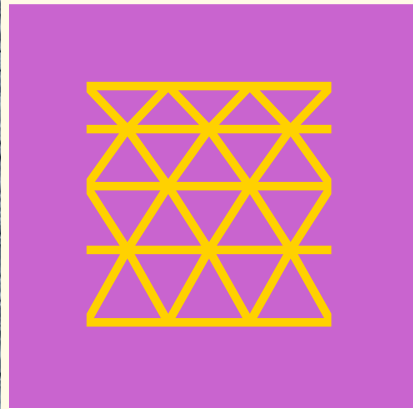
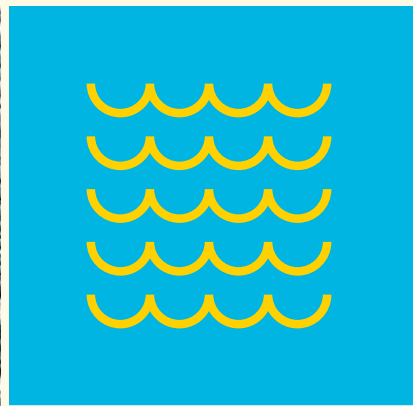
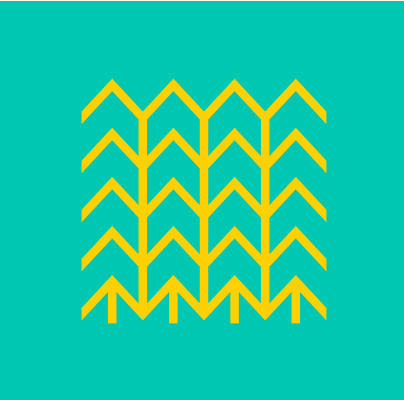


# Annual Report

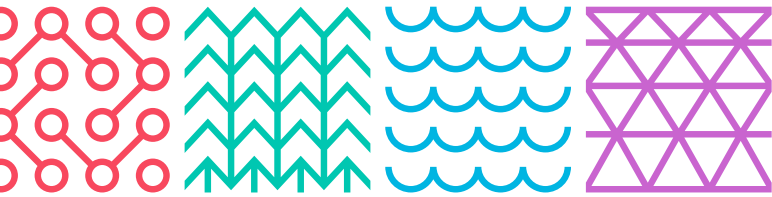
We are happy to report that the Sun Foundation was able to safely meet the challenges FY 2020 COVID-19, and continue to serve its community in new ways and carry out its mission.

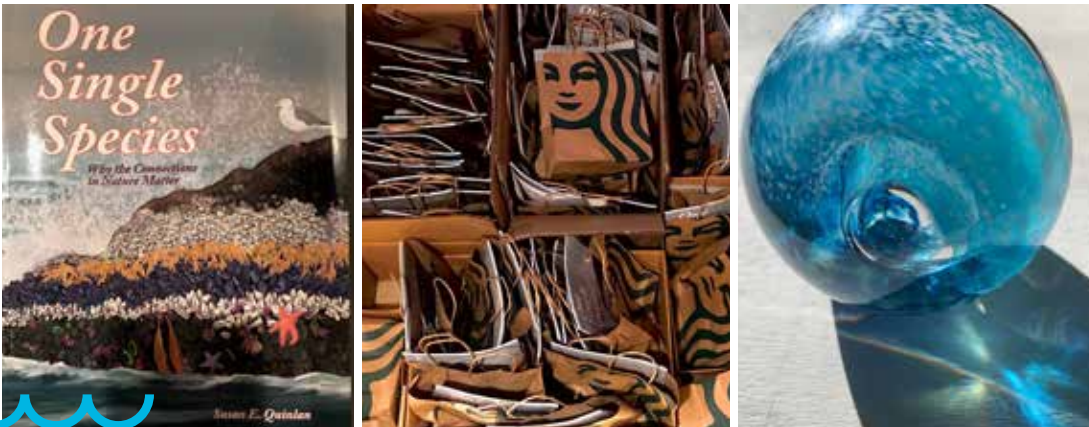

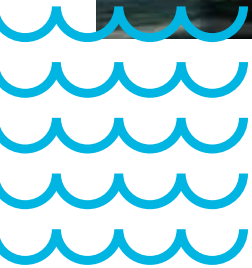


# Clean Water Celebrations

The 28th Clean Water Celebration was ready to share a stellar line up of six youth leaders, the Sea Youth Rise Up delegates of the Ocean Project, along with the choices from 42 special event sessions, five environmental streams, and 40 interactive exhibits, all aligned to the state of Illinois learning goals.

**RISE UP AND A YEAR FOR RESILIENCE**

With a month to go before the event, health protocols needed to control the COVID-19 pandemic necessitated a postponement. These protocols also meant schools were no longer meeting with their students in person and were now engaging in remote learning.

Our keynote speakers, session and streams presenters sent short video clips and an online Clean Water Celebration was created for our audiences. Images and video clips from the 2019 event helped create the feel of an entire day of sessions, interactive exhibits, and environmental streams. We even posted lunch time and sorting our waste streams at the zero waste stations!

"You Inspire Us" gift packets were distributed to all registered schools and organizations.

Resilient, the Clean Water Celebration Navigating Committee committed to continuing the Clean Water Celebration and providing resources for audiences online in 2020. Plans also began to enrich online experiences for 2021 as well as a future in person celebration in 2022.

# Art & Science in the Woods



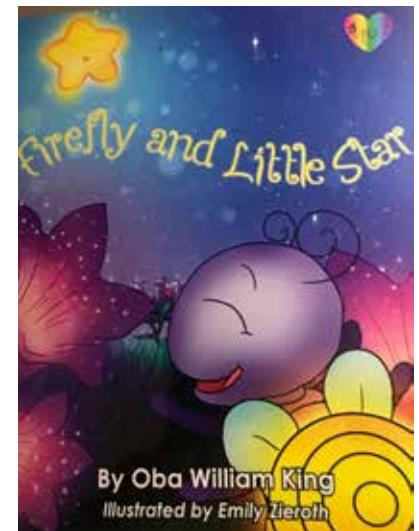

**D**ue to the pandemic the 48th year of the Art and Science in the Woods summer program was postponed until summer of 2021. A special thank you to program director **Brett Root Ericksen** who researched virtual platform options and worked with other camps to forecast if the program could be presented. Thank you to Brett and program coordinator **Sharon Obrey** for the many weeks they followed the science and made adjustment to postpone the program. The Neighborhood House of Peoria (one of the youth agencies that the summer program serves) reached out and asked if the Sun Foundation could create educational enrichment kits for their 86 students who did not have consistent Internet service, computers, and limited income. During the year the Sun Foundation created for Neighborhood House students STEAM, Art and STEM Sun Kits. Neighborhood House Volunteers delivered the kits to the students with their meals. Blick Art Materials donated the art supplies for the Art and STEAM Sun Kits. Our local business donated supplies for the STEM Sun Kits. A new partnership was formed with Barnes and Noble providing discounted books for the program. Nature's Haven of Peoria surprised us with a fundraiser for the Sun Foundation which raised \$1,500 that will be used for materials for the enrichment kits.

Associate artists

**Preston Jackson, Oba King** and **William Butler** created the instruction content for the visual art kits. Included in the kits they sent an invitation for the students, when it is safe, to visit the Peoria Contemporary Art Center. Oba King in his book Sun Kit sent a personal letter and return address envelope for the students to send Oba their thoughts and their writing.



Neighborhood House students receiving the kits will be invited to the Sun Foundation Art and Science in the Woods program in June 2021 or if postponed June 2022. Students will have the opportunity during the program to study with the artists they have connected with through the Sun Kits.

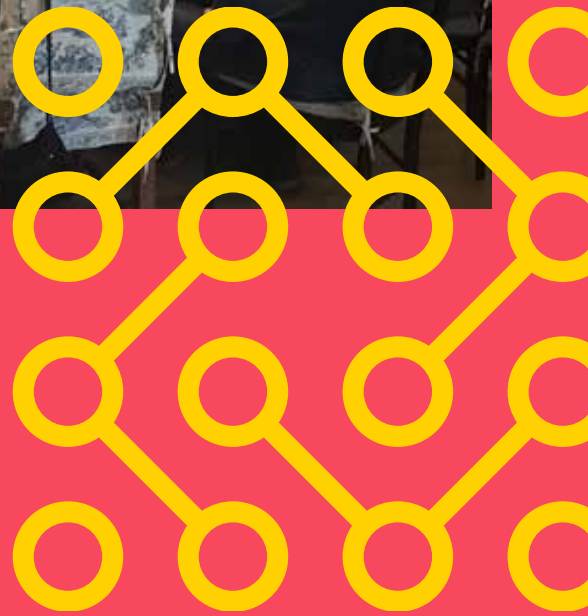


# Community Arts Access Grants

The Sun Foundation, in collaboration with the Illinois Arts Council and the National Endowment for the Arts, awards grants for community and public arts programming.



**C**ommunity Arts Access Grants are funded by an awarded grant from the Illinois Arts Council, a state agency and matching funds from local business and individual donors. Last year, the Sun Foundation was awarded a \$10,000 grant for community and public arts programs for regranting.

With this grant and matching contributions from **Katherine and James Weber, Mary Ann Child, First National Bank of Lacon, Hallmark Corporation and Goodfield Bank**, the Sun Foundation awarded \$12,500 to schools, arts organizations, and community groups throughout rural counties of Bureau, Marshall, Stark and Woodford.

The program was fully underway when the pandemic impact was in effect. Grantees were able to adapt and innovate their programs with safety measures in effect.

Our website continues to provide an important means for communication, reaching over 12,900 unique visitors over the fiscal year, an increase of 3% from the previous year.

The Sun Foundation designed and produced hard copy and electronic promotional brochures posters and flyers. Program materials were distributed to area community festivals, local businesses, local libraries, local schools and internet links.

## PUBLICATION – PROGRAM GUIDE

other area arts organization's calendars and program information. The program guide is published annually and has a distribution of 30,000 printed copies. Additionally, an electronic copy of the guide was posted to the Sun Foundation's website.

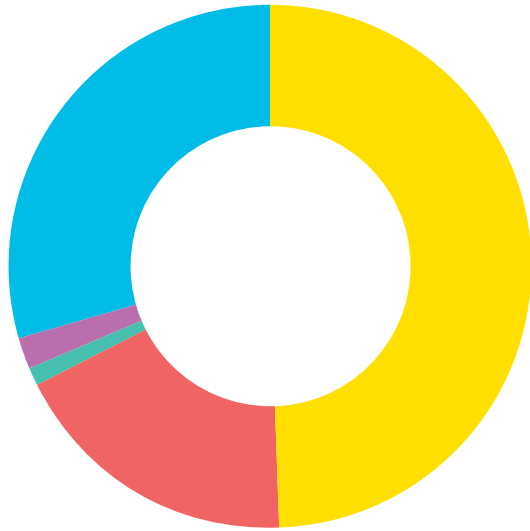

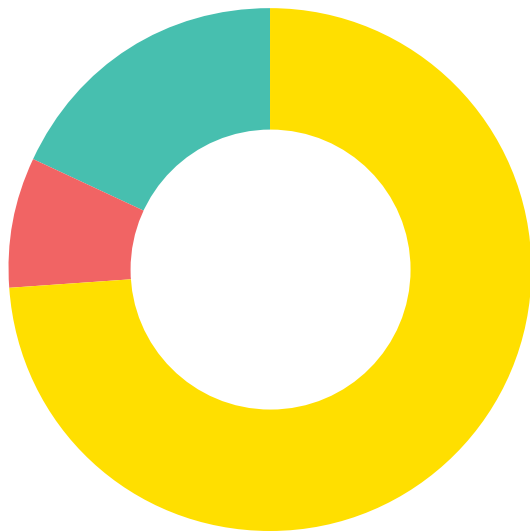

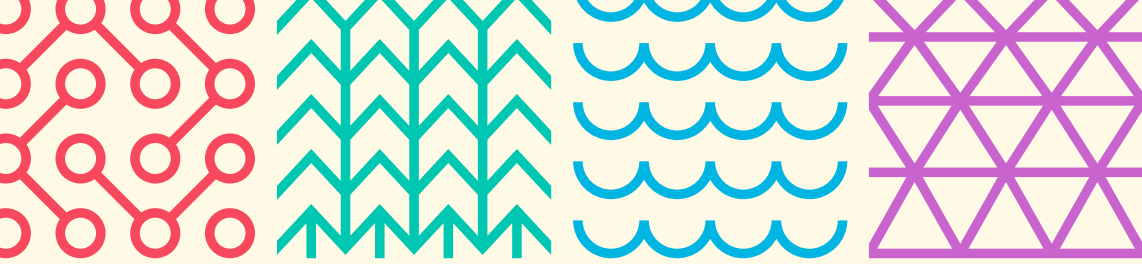
